Health Walk: Parks & Green Spaces of Frome Starting outside Frome Library

Explore the green spaces of Frome and take in various points of local interest on a moderate walk.

This is a free Somerset Health Walk, these walks take place regularly to increase wellbeing.

War Graves Starting at St John's Church forecourt

This moderate 2-mile walk will visit Frome's £5* Commonwealth War Graves, over 50 across 4 churchyards. finishing at Frome Memorial Theatre which is home to the Charlie Robbins statue and the Town War Memorial. Dr Jim Clipson, a Royal Navy veteran, will lead this walk. Dr Clipson has visited the 224 graves of the Great War men from Frome listed on the Town War Memorial in a remarkable research project cycling across Europe. This walk is unsuitable for children under 12 and dogs.

Frome Building Stones

Discover the different stones used to build Frome, with local geologist Simon Carpenter. Simon will discuss how the stones were formed and what they tell us about ancient environments, and will bring along some local fossils to help with interpretation. This fascinating 2-mile walk sold out fast last year, so make sure you book early if you'd like to come along.

Plagues of Frome

A Very Short Walk Around the Long History of Frome

If you love hearing about local history but don't fancy climbing a mile up and down steep cobbled streets, try this gentle version of regular walk Heart of Frome. Frome Town Guide Lisa Kenwright will take you on a short walk exploring the historic centre of the town in detail, uncovering the hidden layers of the past and how they have shaped the modern town we can see today. The walk will be over pavement with two road crossings at dropped kerbs and mostly flat with one short steep slope, and will finish at the foot of Church Steps. The content is suitable for all, particularly families. 0.3 miles.

Longbridge Deverill Starting at the George Inn, BA12 7DG

A mostly level walk on quiet country roads, good footpaths and forest tracks, exploring Longbridge Deverill and the historic area of Sand Hill and Southleigh Woods. No stiles. Toilets and refreshments available at the end, at the pub. 4-mile walk led by Michael Weale. Free parking at the George Inn.

Part of the Frome Walking Wheel
